WRITING—The end of year data is pleasing. Our learners have made significant progress from January this year whereby 61% of learners were 'at or above' expectation compared with our December 2015 achievement at 82.3%. Our target for 2015 was 85%. There are no gender or

READING—. Our reading results are outstanding! **94.4%** of our students are 'at' or 'above' National Standards in December 2015 and our target for the year was **90%**.

MATHS—The data tells us that 86.7% of our learners have achieved or are above National Standards in Maths. Our target for 2015 was 90%. All staff should be proud of our collective achievements.
