Galloping finish Gets Gold!

Yesterday Elena O'leary smashed Mark Todd's world record in the cross country component of Equestrian. Together with her horse Coffee she made history, by winning gold in record breaking fashion. The crowd was roaring and screaming Elena's name as she finished her race beating the world record by four precious seconds!

Elena said her hands were freezing and couldn't stop Coffee from going as fast ... could and after the event he was puffing like a puffer fish! Elena was thoroughly proud of Coffee and gave him his favourite, apple and carrot stew.

We asked her how she got her love for horses and she said "When I was little we owned a little shetland called Bunny she looked very cute but being a Shetland she was the naughtiest of them all. Every time I rode her she would buck me off at least 5 times and I would have to go into the paddock an hour before our ride because she would never let me catch her. As I grew up though, I soon taught her who's boss and after I realised that Bunny taught me how to ride and now I think of her as the best pony ever."

We also got a chance to interview Elena's parents and they told us a little story about Elena. When Elena was about a year old it was like she was addicted to horses because she would always find herself in a dangerous position rather on top of a horse or running around their paddock chasing them saying 'ponies'! Her parents described her as a magnet to horses and said that's how she got her love for horses!

Elena created the new world record setting higher standards than anyone had ever done before! She set the new record at a whopping time of 1 minute and 34 seconds, making history, a country girl from Whangaehu valley in New Zealand! Making her country proud, at an age of nineteen the one and only Elena O'leary!



Try This at Home ... YUM!

- 1 cup short grain or sushi rice
- 1 ¾ cup water
- 2 Trice vinegar or wine vinegar or white vinegar
- ¼ tsp salt
- 4 sheets yaki nori (roasted seaweed)
- cucumber sticks
- carrot sticks
- red pepper sticks

½ 200g can tuna in spring water, drained and flaked 1 egg beaten with 1 T water, salt and pepper to taste 2 tsp oil



- 1. Rinse rice in a sieve under cold water, drain.
- 2. Bring water and rice to the boil; lower heat, cover, simmer 12 minutes.
- 3. While rice is cooking make an omelet with the egg, water, salt and pepper and cook in a frypan. Set aside to cool then slice into fine strips.
- 4. Remove rice from the heat and stand, covered, for 10 minutes.
- 5. Mix together vinegar, sugar and salt, stir until sugar has dissolved.
- 6. Sprinkle vinegar mix over rice, then stir with a wooden spoon to break up lumps.
- 7. Lay a sheet of glad wrap on a rolling mat and cover with a nori sheet then a layer of warm rice.
- 8. Arrange vegetable strips along the side of the sushi nearest to you with the flaked tuna and omelet strips.
- 9. Roll up firmly using the mat and glad wrap to help form a compact cylinder shape.
- 10. Remove rolling mat and seal ends of glad wrap. Repeat with the remaining ingredients. Chill the sushi rolls until firm, then cut into slices with a sharp knife.
- 11. Serve with soy sauce and wasabi paste for dipping.
