2016 DATA FOR FORDELL SCHOOL

Our 2016 data is due to be reported to the Ministry of Education. Below is a table showing our progress from the start of the year. **Mathematics** - Our target for this year was to have 90% of Fordell Students achieving 'At and Above'. We have 87% and have just missed our target by 3%.

Reading - Our target for reading this year was to have 95% of Fordell Students achieving 'At and Above'. We have 97% and have met our target.

Writing - Our target for writing this year was to have 85% of Fordell Students achieving 'At and Above'. We have 90% and have met our target.


This table doesn't show the individual success of our students; we have students shifting from 'At' into the 'Above', 'Below' into 'At' and 'Well Below' into 'Below' which is accelerated progress

and closing the gap for them to meet the National Standard for their age. We are very proud of all students and all the efforts
they have put in. Well done to all staff on the team effort they have put into raising and accelerating achievement

This year has seen a few changes in the data we have been collecting. We have reviewed the assessment tools and aligned them to enable us to use the information to better inform teaching, next steps and progress. This second-tier data is then collated at individual, class, year groups and whole school levels. As a staff, we have had monitoring meetings where we regularly discuss student progress and how we can accelerate it further – working collaboratively about each child. This analysis and use of data will continue next year. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask myself or one of the teachers.

Lauren's Community Service as part of Tuia Challenge


