Why we climb trees at Fordell School

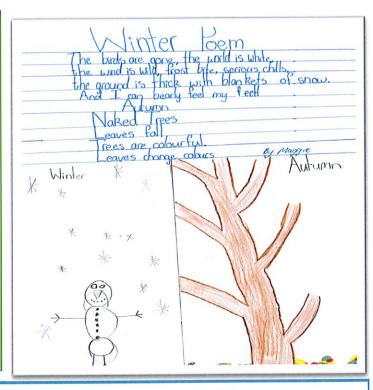
Dear Trustee and Community

Mmmm tasty burgers! Eyes off Ari.

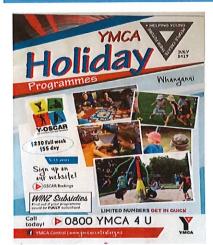




Yum, homemade burgers and chips. I can make this at home - it tastes better than bought ones! I need this recipe – it is delicious!

Courgette Pizza

(Tasty lunch box idea)

INGREDIENTS

3 ½ cups grated courgette 3 eggs

¼ vegetable oil

1/2 cup wholemeal flour

2Tbsp chopped parsley

black pepper to taste

2Tbsp tomato paste

3 cups prepared vegetables. E.g., chopped capsicum, tomatoes, broccoli. ¼ cup grated cheese

METHOD

- Place grated courgette in a colander and allow to drain for 30 minutes
- Preheat oven to 180 degrees and spray a baking dish with a little vegetable oil.
- Beat eggs and vegetable oil together in a large bowl, add flour and mix.
- Add the drained courgette, chopped parsley and pepper and mix together.
- Spread the mixture in a baking dish and bake for 10-15 minutes until the base is firm.
- 6. Remove from oven, spread with tomato paste.
- Place prepared vegetables chopped capsicum, tomato, broccoli on top and sprinkle with the grated cheese.
- 8. Remove from oven, cool and slice into squares.
