

Fordell School will be Buzzing with Bees

Earlier this term Fordell School was notified that it had been selected to receive our very own Bee Hive (actually, it is a Bees Nest) from New World Wanganui. With much excitement it arrived last Wednesday. Our bees are very unique in that they are special bees called Leafcutter Bees. They don't produce honey and are not aggressive around their nesting box. They are bees that pollinate the flowers. They are called Leafcutter bees because they use cut leaf fragments to construct their nest cells. In about 21 days our Leafcutter Bees will wake up and begin pollinating around Fordell School, adding to our sustainability learning that we do. Next time you are in school you might like to have a look. Next to our Leafcutter Nest we also have a Bumblebee Nesting box ®
