Our 4Rs are: Resourcefulness, Reciprocity, Resilience and Reflectiveness. This Flyer I will explain the muscle of Reflectiveness. Reflectiveness is being ready, willing and able to become more strategic about learning. This muscle is made up of:

- o Planning: Working learning out in advance.
- Revising: Monitoring and adapting along the way.



Distilling: Drawing out the lessons from experience.

Meta-learning: Understanding learning, and yourself as a learner.

An example of this Learning Muscle in action is the Soap Box Derby Cars that Room 2 learners

designed, created and revised before coming up with their final Derby Car to compete with. Using all 4 Learning Muscles throughout this process - kai pai to mahi Fordell students.




GROWTH MINDSET in Room 4
