
over both days - I was extremely proud of all 15 of them - what an inspiring group of Year 7 and 8 students.

October 21, 1917

Dear Mum and Dad,

It's another terrible week in hell. Even wrapped in my muddy trench coat, the icy wind freezes me. Mixed stenchs of B.O., dead bodies and urine crawl up my nose all day long. Over-sized rats scurry around the trenches, spreading diseases wherever they go. I'm surprised I'm not sick yet.

Yesterday was dreadful, the Germans gassed us at dusk, I was lucky. Others were not, so I spent the night dragging stale corpses out of the dirty trenches. Once again, the enemies took us by surprise this morning. As the blood red sun creeped up on us, so did the Germans, the continuous gunfire left my right ear deaf.

Life is extremely painful here on the Western Front in France. I would rather be back in Egypt, with the rest of my battalion. All we ever did was train, travel and admire the towering pyramids. It was so peaceful compared to the horrible battlefield and disgusting trenches.


Every night I dream of home. Mouth-watering meals, roaring fireplace, my warm, cosy bed. I would do anything to come home.
