

The Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) School-Wide framework supports all NZ schools to strengthen their whole-school commitment to wellbeing and inclusive education. This framework enables schools to build a culture where positive behaviour and learning is a way of life.

PB4L-SW is based on international evidence and research and looks at behaviour and learning from a whole school, as well as an individual student perspective. Currently there are 101 schools in the Taranaki, Whangaui and Manawatu region.

Last week our regional facilitator, Leah, visited Fordell School to survey staff and students around our school systems and values/expectations. She was very impressed with what we had covered in our first year and that she thoroughly enjoyed visiting Fordell School - that it has a very warm and inclusive feel. ©
