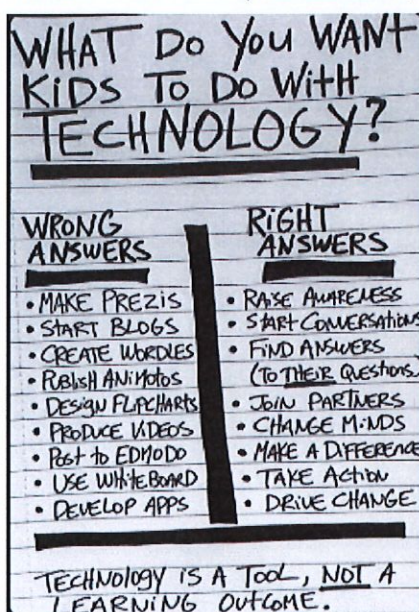

This is where we take the New Zealand Curriculum and localise it to match our Fordell School Values and Vision - "Community partnership creating confident, connected life-long learners". This led to a discussion around what skills do our students, your children, need for the future. Dr Tony Wagner, *The Global Achievement Gap*, **identifies seven core competencies every child needs in order to survive in the coming world of work**. These are: critical thinking and problem solving, collaboration across networks and leading by influence, agility and adaptability, initiative and entrepreneurialism, effective oral and written communication, accessing and analysing information,

and curiosity and imagination. What we are seeing in education and in society is a **shift from compliance to empowerment**. Compliance - is when we are inclined to agree with others or obey rules. Empowering students teaches them to have their own voice and follow their own direction. **To develop the 'leaders of tomorrow' we need to develop them as leaders today**. As we review our Fordell School Curriculum we will be asking for your input - what knowledge and skills do you see as important to shaping your child for their future. Part of this is the Fordell School Graduate Profile, which we continue to add to and update. Something else to think about is digital technology.

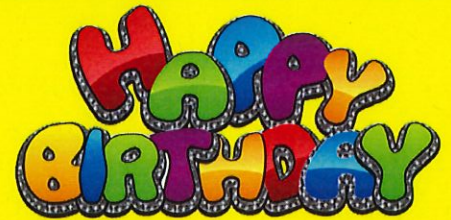

Ali Baba and the Bongo Bandits

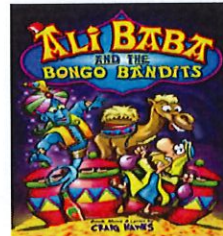

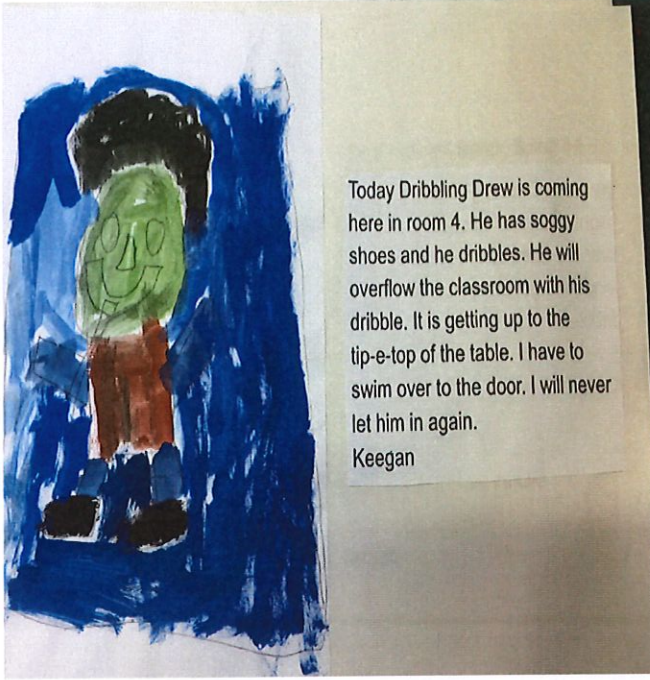

Dribbling Drew Visited Room 4

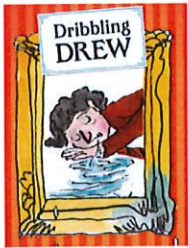

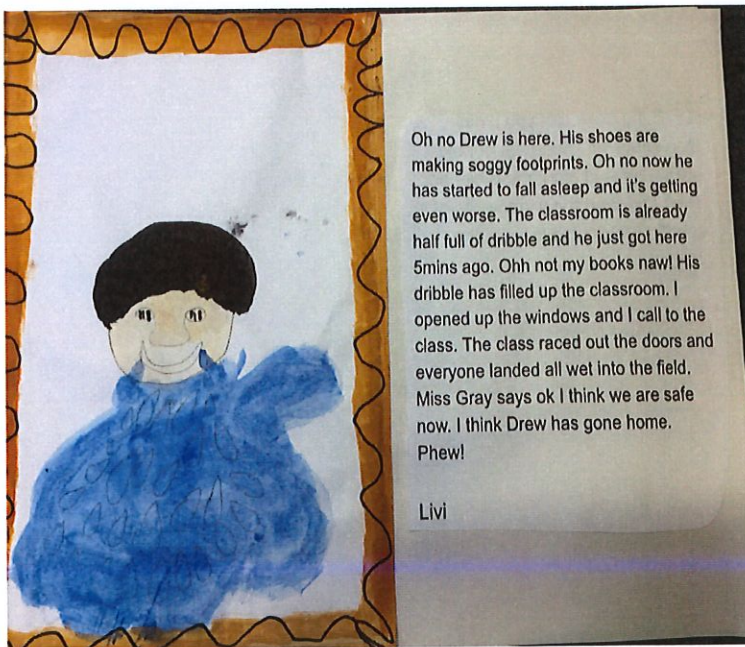

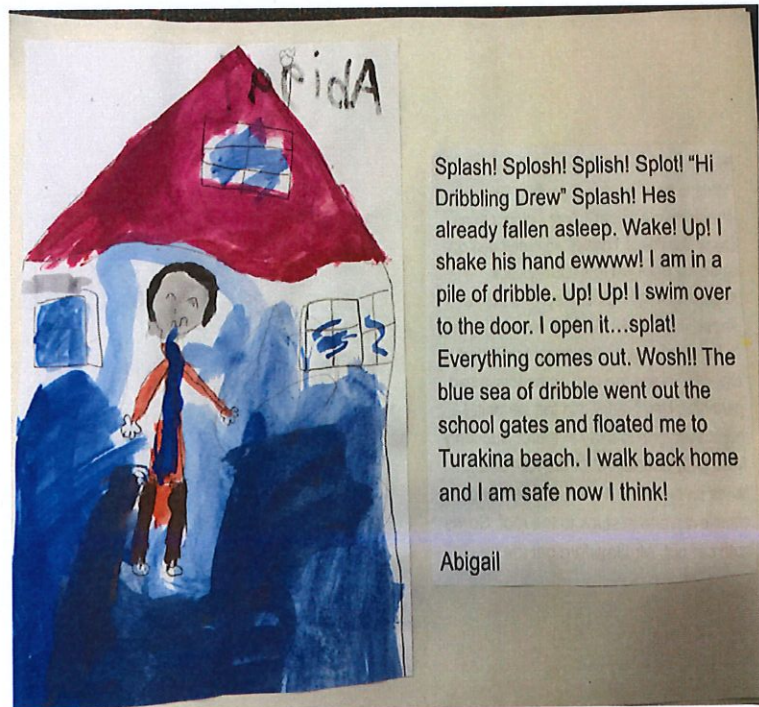
