Tēnā koutou, nau mai, harere mai, namaste. Last week I talked about the

reviewing and evaluating of the Fordell School Curriculum, continuing with this I would like to talk about "Learner Agency". What is "Learner Agency"? - it is when students have a sense of 'agency' when they feel in control of things that happen around them - empowerment.

Derek Wenmoth says "One way of thinking of learner agency is when learners have the 'power to act'. When learners move from being passive recipients to being much more active in the learning process, and actively involved in the decisions about the learning, then they have greater agency."

At Fordell School we look at ways to create empowerment for students, that they are empowered by their learning because it is something that they have a choice and interest in.



Recent examples of this are the Science Fair, Internet Safety Workshop, Homework Challenges, House Challenges, Inquiry Projects right through to the literacy workshops that involve students making a choice to Learning Through Play and Discovery Time.

Part of supporting students in being empowered is ensuring that our students not only know how to learn, but knowing how **they** learn best. This is when our Fordell School Learning Muscles support students in learning how to learn. Our Fordell Learning Muscles are **Reciprocity, Resilience, Resourcefulness and Reflectiveness**.

So PLEASE remind your children to wash their hands.



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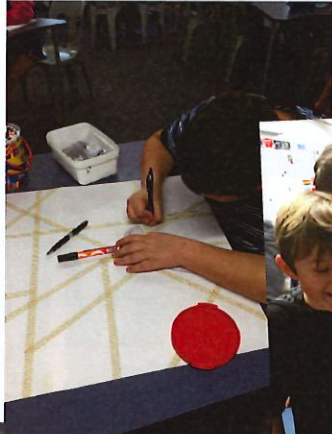
