Muscles - to us they are an important part of our everyday language and programmes, they are deliberately planned into our programmes. You will hear the staff referring to these throughout the day - in class and out around the school. You will also hear students talking about which Learning Muscles they have been using or 'stretching'. We see the Learning Muscles - Reciprocity, Resilience, Resourcefulness and Reflectiveness - as the core capabilities that people use to live, learn, work and contribute as active members of their communities. Our Fordell students will use and develop their Learning Muscles over time therefore being motivated to using them; recognising when and how to do so. Which creates successful learners who are "confident, connected and life-long learners".

Winter Lunch Times - During the colder days we will be eating lunch inside the classrooms, this will be the first 10 minutes of lunch. We recognise it is not pleasant sitting outside in the cold weather and as adults we wouldn't do it. Students are encouraged to then go outside and get some fresh air; however, the classrooms and the library are open for students if they wish to stay inside and do quiet activities. There will be no digital devices during this time as part of our policy is that students are only on devices when a teacher/adult is present and used for supporting/adding


1st Titanium Values Badge at Fordell School - Danielle

News from the Fordell School Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees met on Monday night as your elected representatives of Fordell School. Thank you to the families who voted in the recent Board of Trustees elections. As the board has remained unchanged we were able to get straight to work.

Each board meeting we review a cycle of policies for how the school runs. We studied and contributed to the Mid-Year Evaluations of Fordell School's Strategic Goals and monitoring of our targets. We looked at mid-year curriculum data in reading, maths and writing and our goals around Wellbeing and Stewardship within the school. The board approved the health and safety of the Year 7 and 8 camp to the Marlborough Sounds in Term 4, and decided to use some funds to assist the 2 camps this year for students Year 5/6, and Year 7/8.

There has been much media attention on the government offers to fund \$150 per child instead of charging families for activity fees and donations. The board is waiting for more information before deciding whether or not to use this scheme. There are conditions around extra funds received from the government that may lead to our school having less funds to provide a rich curriculum for our children.

The board recognise the importance of the Tin Shed/Room 5 as a learning and community space, so have decided to upgrade it with new doors, windows, ceiling, walls, insulation and new carpet. This will be funded by savings the board has accumulated. The office area will have new carpet laid.

We will continue to work with the Principal and staff to create and maintain our great little centre of learning - Fordell School.
