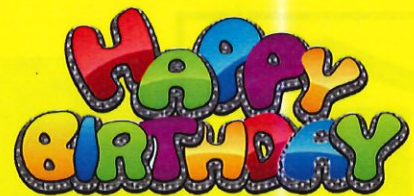

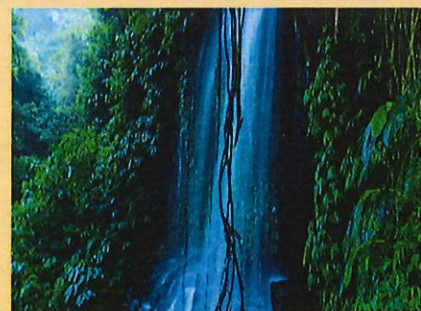
The Tunnel To...

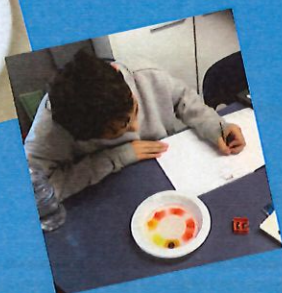
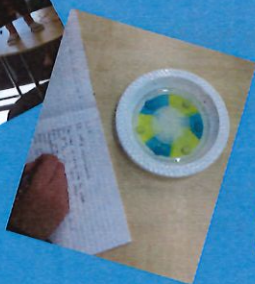
