The scheduled meeting took place on the 19th August.

The focus of our meetings is how we are progressing toward our strategic goals. Our staff continue to be better than before as they undergo more professional development in literacy during the next school holidays.

Thanks to Miss Morrison when the planned year 7 and 8 camp to the South Island became unavailable, she pursued other options until she was able to confirm the Coromandel as the new destination. The RAMs have been approved and we hope everyone has a fantastic time. Our staff always strive to provide a *Rich Curriculum* for our children and we are thankful for these efforts.

2020 term dates and planning has started.

The *Wellbeing* goal continues to be monitored with staff embedding positive behaviour for learning (PB4L) within our school.


We were updated on the progress for the upgrade of Room 5 (the Tin Shed), windows and doors are being made.
