Things to Consider Before Letting Your Children Sign Up to Social Media



Social media can be a great way to stay connected to friends and family, however there can be some risks too. Netsafe have put together some great advice to help parents in keeping their children safe. You can also check out the Online Safety Parent Toolkit for practical tips and tools that will help you, the parent, talk to your child about online safety.

What are age restrictions?

Are you aware that there are minimum sign up ages for Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and You Tube - it is 13 years. This is because a child's social and emotional capability is still developing which can make it more difficult to identify and manage challenges that may occur on a platform designed for adults and teens. If your child is under 13 and keen to use social media, consider their capability to manage online challenges before setting up a profile. It is better your child is honest with you as you can help them to stay safe online.

This term we have been learning ways to solve multiplication problems. We use different ways to help us learn and apply our times tables knowledge.

Some of us have been learning our timetables through repeated addition and using known facts and others have been using place value to solve equations.
