about your child's learning and wellbeing.



Restorative Practices at Fordell School is the Social Discipline Window, which is

made up of four sections. The four sections are represented as different combinations of high or low structures/expectations and high or low support. The restorative domain combines both high structures/expectations and high support and is characterised by doing things with people, rather than to them or forthem. Research tells



us that "human beings are happier, more cooperative and productive, and **more** likely to make positive changes in their behaviour when those in positions of authority do things <u>With</u> them, rather than to them or for them" ©.


