Juanita's Family Favourite Sweet Treat ---- Jelly Slice

Base – 1 packet plain biscuits - crushed, 125gm butter -melted, mix and press into a tin and chill in the fridge.

Filling – 2 tbsps gelatine – soaked in a little bit of cold water then add boiling water to make up to ¾ cup, 1 tin condensed milk, 2 tbsps lemon juice, mix and pour over the chilled base.

Topping – Dissolve 1 packet jelly in 1 cup of boiling water, let it cool.

Once the jelly has cooled, pour over the condensed milk filling, chill until set then cut into slices. Enjoy!

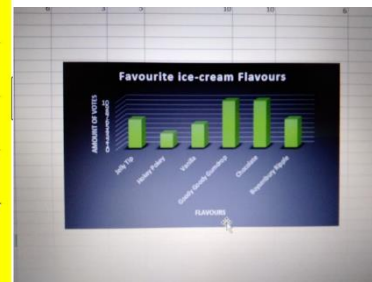
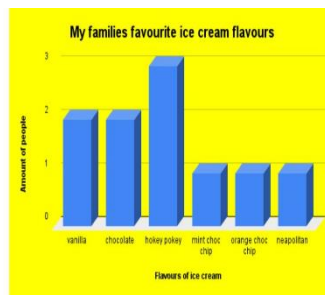
Distance Learning
