COVID-19 Information - As you will know we have moved to Phase 3 of the Omicron Response. This means that only household contacts of a case isolate. All other contacts should continue to monitor for symptoms but can carry on attending school. If any symptoms arise, they should stay home from school and get a test. We do ask that should your family get Covid please notify the school, especially if your child was positive while at school, we will then notify families that we have a case in our community, so they are able to keep a look out for symptoms. This means that we hope to have less students and staff away from
