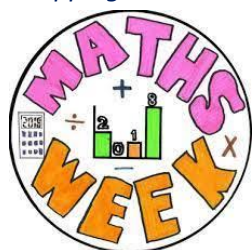

Every week in NZ, three families are told the heart-breaking news that their child has cancer.

On Labour weekend last year 6 year old Maggie, became that statistic and was diagnosed with T-Cell Lymphoblastic Lymphoma; it is a rare form of aggressive non-Hodgkin's lymphoma/ blood cancer. She is now just over a third of a way into her treatment.

The Child Cancer Foundation are a charity that have helped Maggie's family on this crazy journey and they are running a national fundraiser event on Wednesday the 7th of September called Wig Wednesday.

DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE A TUMMY BUG?

How to treat Tummy Bugs (Gastroenteritis)

Little ones can get dehydrated very quickly when they get an upset tummy, vomiting or diarrhoea, which often results in visits to the doctor or sometimes admission into hospital.

Did you know you can visit your local pharmacy to get advice and early treatment to help children recover?

The Pedialyte rehydration initiative started August 2021 and is available to all children aged three months to 15 years. This service is free and is available at any Pharmacy in the Whanganui region including the rural areas i.e. Marton, Bulls, Taihape, and Ohakune. Giving Pedialyte or even just water in a quantity of 1ml per kg every 5 minutes can mean that the child can be on the road to recovery within a few hours.

What is RSV infection?

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is a very common virus in the winter and spring months in New Zealand. It is one of many viruses that cause infections of the respiratory tract.

The respiratory tract is the parts of the body related to breathing like the nose, windpipe, air passages in the lungs, and the lungs

Key points to remember about respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) infection

- RSV is a very common virus in the winter and spring months in Aotearoa New Zealand
- RSV causes infections of the respiratory tract (the parts of the body related to breathing)
- the symptoms are similar to a cold
- most children don't have serious problems
- in some babies and young children, the virus can cause serious illness including bronchiolitis and pneumonia
- these babies and young children may need hospital care
- RSV spreads very easily - wash hands regularly and keep babies and young children away from people who have colds and coughs
- if your baby or child has any new respiratory symptoms, please keep them away from daycare or school until they no longer have symptoms, and call Healthline on [0800 611 116](tel:0800611116) or your general practice.

You can use this form to nominate yourself or someone else in your community. We have nomination forms available in Te Reo Māori and some other languages. Please contact the returning officer if these are required.

Nominating yourself or someone else

If you are on the voting roll and eligible to vote, you can nominate yourself. Please remember to sign **both** parts of the form

If you are nominating someone else, complete the nomination form and make sure it includes all the required contact details and signatures.

You can post, hand deliver or email your nomination form/s to the returning officer (see details below). Nominations close at **noon** on 15th August 2022

Candidate statement

If you are a candidate, you are invited to submit an optional statement (up to 400 words) and photo. Make sure your statement is received by **noon** on 15th August 2022 so that it can be sent to voters with the voting papers.

The returning officer may remove or edit any part of the candidate's statement if it exceeds 400 words or is offensive or defamatory.

Electoral roll

The electoral roll is held at the school office and can be viewed during normal school hours.

Eligibility

Anyone can stand for election to the board, except for some exclusions. Please check information on who is not eligible. If not enclosed, ask the returning officer for this. If you are not on the voting roll you must be nominated by a person who is.

Scrutineers

A candidate may nominate a person to sit with the returning officer during the vote count to make sure it is done correctly. Scrutineers are also required for electronic elections if a recount is needed. Please advise the returning officer in writing of your scrutineer's name and contact details before election day. Candidates **cannot** be scrutineers.

Voting and results

Electronic voting will not be an option for this election.

If there are more nominations than vacancies for parent representatives, a voting election will be held. Eligible voters will be issued voting papers and candidate statements, on or before 22nd August 2022

The poll closes at **4pm** on 19th September 2022 The highest polling candidates will be elected to the board, and results will be notified to the school community and other affected parties.
