

- Fordell School Board Corner - A Reflection on the Value of School Camps.

A major highlight of the year for many of our senior students is school camp. It is looked forward to with anticipation. There is a huge amount of time and cost in getting our students off school grounds, the paperwork is a small novel. The return on the investment is immeasurable.

I had the privilege of attending Makahika with the year 5 and 6's. What an amazing bunch of kids, they really did Fordell School and themselves proud. They had a variety of activities, a long bush walk, low ropes, high ropes, orienteering and zip line to name a few. These adventures and challenges run by a talented group of instructors, are designed to push children out of their comfort zone, encouraging learning, self-awareness and leadership in a safe environment with a lot of laughter along the way.

One particular challenge required that the students find a way to get their entire team over, under and through a pair of ropes. The biggest challenge turned out to be for the parents, who were not allowed any input at all. There was a bit (a lot) of muttering from all of us! Which made me think how often do we take opportunities away from our children to learn? Some of the biggest lessons in life are the tough ones, when things don't go to plan. When we give children safe environments to be able work their way through problems and learn from their mistakes, we are helping develop a growth mindset and resilience. We are setting them up to be able to make decisions that have bigger consequences later in life and to bounce back when things go wrong. As a parent I learnt something at camp, to step back and let our children develop through their own experiences (when it is safe to do so!).

Alan, who was one of the outstanding instructors at the camp, said to the students on the last day, that it won't be until later in life they will see the true value in what they have learnt at camp, when something happens that requires them to pull on past experiences, and they recall Makahika. Fordell School offers a rich curriculum that serves our children in so many ways, not everything is measurable, experiences are priceless.
