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


Tēnā koutou parents, whanau and Fordell community. It is certainly hard to believe we are now over halfway through term 1. I would like to take a bit of time this Flyer to write about SCHOOL ATTENDANCE. With the disruptions to schooling over the last 3 years it has really impacted school attendance. Recently there has been research conducted to

find out what drives schools'

attendance. What has come out of this is that **parent's attitudes really matter** - parents who aren't comfortable with their child missing school are more likely to ensure that their child attends schools regularly. **Regular attendance makes a big difference, as does a child coming late to school** (they have missed the start of the day and the beginning of a lesson). **Every day counts**, missing too many days leads to lower achievement and poorer wellbeing. Regular attendance is when a learner misses less than a week of school in a term. A day here and there adds up to a lot - Did you know that learners who miss **a week** of school each term will have missed out on **a year** of schooling by the time they are 16! **95% attendance is considered good attendance**, this allows for 9 absent days in a year. At Fordell School we endeavor to make sure we have

engaging and motivating learning, with lots of opportunities for learners to be curious, build onto previously learnt skills, and master new skills. Our current school attendance is sitting at: 85%. Let's work together and see if can shift this to 90% by the end of the term. If you
