Online Safety – Our Kids Online

Here are a few tips that came from the recent Cybersafe Evening:

- No devices in bedrooms and turn off WiFi overnight.
- Add a Youth Helpline number to your child's contacts in their phone so they have an alternative 'safe space' if needed.
- Download apps that your kids have and use them in the mindset of a child their age.
- Set parental controls/know the recommended age for apps (it was recommended adding a few years!).
- No child should ever have unfiltered access to the internet. Filters block adult content, allowing you to connect your children's device to the filter, while you as an adult still get to use the unfiltered WiFi.
- For teens, help them navigate the current landscape.
- For younger children, put off sole device ownership as long as possible.
- Join the parenting in a tech world Facebook page with over 280k families discussing tech and kids.
