Tēnā koutou parents, whanau and Fordell community. This week has been **Kindness Week** and as a school we have all made extra efforts to do kind things for each other, and learning about how to make good choices and to value and respect the views of others. The **Learning Muscle Reciprocity** has aligned perfectly with Kindness Week. The Reciprocity Learning Muscle is about being able to learn with and from others, as well as learning on your own. To be able to do this students learn about:

- **Collaboration:** knowing how to manage yourself in the give and take of collaborative venture, respecting and recognising other viewpoints, adding to and drawing from the strength of working in a team.
- Imitation: Constructively adopting methods, habits or values from other people.
- **Empathy and Listening:** Contributing to others' experiences by listening and understanding what they are really saying and putting yourself in their shoes/position.
- Interdependence: Knowing when it's appropriate to learn on your own or with others, and being able to stand your ground in a debate.

You can support your child at home by drawing attention to, and model positive learning habits. E.g.,

- Demonstrate/model being a good learner.
- Work, play and learn alongside your children, enabling them to pick up good habits through imitation.
- Make expectations of turn-taking and cooperation clear.

Book Week - Book Week is **week 6**. This is the week where Fordell celebrates all things reading and books. Your child will have been involved in all types of activities during this week, and leading up to it. We like to give our families warning of this week so they can be organised for the **dress up day on Friday 2 June - come dressed as**

your favourite book character. This day is also the day students invite their VIP (Very Important Person/s) to Fordell School. The Senior Hub have been busy throughout this term working on their story telling skills and these will be shared on this day. An invitation for the day will be coming home. During Book Week there is also a Book Fair running in the office, this is a great way to have a look at new books out there and engage with your child finding out what they like to read. 






















FORDELL COMMUNITY POOL SOCIETY TRUST AGM

Shaking as the cherry-coloured leaves fall to the ground to their final destination. Growing older with every shiver.


Getting more naked as the leaves float down. Slowly growing wiser. left alone.

Crinkling


Twisting
