Puanga is the Māori name for Rigel the star in the Orion constellation

Puanga is the brightest and biggest star and in some locations in New Zealand can be found first.

Puanga is a time to observe the Maramataka which, guided Māori about best times to fish, planting times, and the arrival of birds. The magnitude scale astronomers use goes from 1 to 6. The brightest stars in our sky are magnitude 1 and the dimmest stars in our sky are magnitude 6. Puanga is a magnitude 1 star while Matariki is a magnitude 6.
