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
Tēnā koutou parents, whānau and Fordell School community. It sure has been great to see the sun lately. This has meant that with the ground drying up we were able to hold

This week with the sunny days we have been having it prompted me to think about the up and coming summer season with swimming in mind.

DID you know that before the Fordell Swimming Pool was built and opened in 1938 (yes, it is going to be 85 this summer) that the Fordell School children were invited to swim down the Warrengate Road at the Sutherland's property at Thornhill.

Lewanna McLean (nee Sutherland) said her parents had an old metal pit that her father was able to make a swimming pool area for them to learn to swim. It was 3 to 4 feet deep and filled with spring water.

The school children would walk down (the Warrengate road was metal then) have their swim. The changing shed was "behind a clump of gorse" and then walk back up the hill to school.

The Fordell Pool was built for the workers on the tunnel and on completion of the tunnel when the workers left, the Minister of Public Works Bob Sempel gifted the pool to the community and what a gift it has been.




This Week In Room 4
