We ask that you get creative when baking because Tawa is going to WIN!!!!!


All outer space decorations are appreciated, please come and see house leaders Annabel, Jonty and Eli if you have any questions.

He will be presenting the lesson in a very informal way along with a Q and A to offer his advise and experience on how you can support your child as they navigate the online world.



There are species we can use for weaving (raranga), making manu (kites), and for medicinal purposes (rongo \bar{a}). We are very grateful to Horizons Regional Council, Kaitoke Prison Nursery & Minimoor Nursery for supplying the plants, and to Mrs Glasgow and Mr Robertson for sharing their expertise.
